## A Guide for Undecided Students: Pathways to a Major

- This chart is intended to guide the undecided student prior to selecting a major. Students are encouraged to try some of the options and consult with a Contra Costa College Counselor prior to selecting a major if they are unsure of their educational goals. Students who are undecided about their career and/or educational goals are also encouraged to enroll in a Career and Major Exploration (COUNS-130) course in their first semester at Contra Costa College.
- Contra Costa College offers majors in a wide range of interest areas with each one offering a specific degree.
- Students who are interested in transferring to a 4 -year college generally complete "Transferrable General Education" and "Major Prerequisite" courses. Students can also select a major that offers: Associate in Arts Transfer (AA-T) or Associate in Science Transfer (AS-T).
- Students interested in entering the workforce after earning a degree generally select a major that offers: Associate in Arts (AA) or Associate in Science (AS).
- These four degrees follow the tradition that a college degree indicates the graduate has a knowledge base beyond a single area of specialization. This knowledge base is represented below in the shaded categories which are the General Education (G.E.) courses. All courses listed on this guide fulfill General Education requirements for graduation and should also transfer to 4 - year colleges.
- Certificate programs are also offered at Contra Costa College and they are intended to give an in-depth knowledge in one particular area to enable students to move to the workforce more quickly.
