Cancellation of Classes (Discussion) The ASC would like the District to release information of what the new management organization costs and what impact the new dean positions have on students. It was suggested that the ASU send students to the January 29 Governing Board meeting to address the issue of class cancellations. Some students may not be able to graduate or transfer because of class cancellations. The students need to remind the Board that the Chancellor works for them, not the other way around. There is a proposed increase in fees from \$11 to \$24 per unit. It was suggested that students with BA be charged more and leave the fees charged to AA degrees as is. Saul will discuss a possibility of a vote of no confidence for the Chancellor with the union and FSCC.
