Chemistry Department Equivalency Policy

Advancement to candidacy for a doctorate in chemistry shall be deemed equivalent to an earned masters degree.

Equivalency may be met by written evidence of the following:

1. A master's or doctoral degree in any biological or physical science, or in engineering, from an accredited domestic or foreign institution with at least thirty upper division and/or graduate level semester units in chemistry, biochemistry, environmental chemistry, or closely related areas.

AND

2. One year of successful college-level chemistry teaching experience, within the past five years.

OR


3. Two years of professional-level work experience in chemistry, biochemistry, or a closely related field; or in chemical engineering, biochemical engineering, or environmental engineering.

OR

4. Scholarly projects in the area of chemistry as defined in Section 20.4 (E2b) of the United Faculty contract. such scholarly projects could include published journal articles, book chapters, presentations at professional meeting, and/or theses.
