CALL TO ORDER: The meeting was called to order at 2:15 p.m.

Development of Desirable Qualifications for CCC President Position The ASC does not have an option to develop a question for the interview.

Spring 06 Student Enrollment/Class Cancellation Process Discussion There was much concern expressed with the enrollment process. It was suggested that if the District Office wants to build morale, it's doing a poor attempt at it by canceling classes. 1) Classes should not be canceled one week before school starts because usually it comes down to enrollment of the first day. 2) There is no assistance at night to direct students to classes and no police patrol. 3) Counseling is over-burdened now because of the cancellations. 4) CIS 135 was going to be cancelled because there were only 15 students enrolled by the first day. 5) Part-time faculty should be compensated for the prep time they have put in only to have a class cancelled. 6) Terence has pointed out to the administrations that ten students in a class will still pay for itself, but administration is concerned that there may be less by the end of the semester. 7) There is no Director of Admissions. When asked when that position will be filled, Terence said that there is no push to get it filled. 8) Couldn't overpopulated classes cover the under populated courses? Couldn't the FTES be shared between departments, divisions, and/or college-wide? 9) By canceling classes, administration makes it more difficult to keep FTES up. FTES needs to be focused on a larger level; by department, division, or college-wide enrollment. The ASC disagrees with the enrollment plan of the District.

District Faculty Senate Retreat Discussion This was originally a plan to include the three Faculty Senates but the CCC Senate would like to organize a faculty SLO retreat instead.

Equivalency Process Discussion Originally, the ASC Equivalency Committee (consisting of Terence, Chris, and Barbara) was only going to meet one time each month to review department equivalencies. The decision to meet every Thursday may be made because of the urgency of certain hire. This issue will be taken to the Council of Chairs.

SLO and Assessment Efforts Update Eighteen departments have finished their SLOs. Terence succeeded in organizing a group of general education department chairs to work on the GE SLOs. They will be meeting on the second Wednesday in AA216 from 2 - 4 p.m.

FSCC The FSCC is discussing changing the language in the Uniform Hiring Guide regarding the Discipline requiring a Master's Degree equivalency process. The ASC feels that department chair feedback is needed, so a copy of the changes will be sent to the Senators to share with their divisions. FSCC is also working on the morale goal. The Chancellor has asked the ASC presidents to push to improve relationships by having a Code of Ethics that would include participating on Program Reviews, attending committees, and attending All College Day. CCC would like to have the following (A shared governance role in the enrollment process regarding enrollment and class cancellation policies.) added to the FSCC 2005-06 Goals which are suppose to reflect the District's Strategic Plan. Rudy will not be able to continue his participation in FSCC. A new representative is needed.
