	3	Requirement to add language to 6 TMCs: Math 110 and Intermediate Algebra  "As a requirement of this TMC, students earning an ADT in are required to demonstrate competency in mathematics at the level of intermediate algebra in addition to the coursework listed above. Students may demonstrate this competency through the college's assessment for placement process or through the completion of an intermediate algebra mathematics course. The inclusion of this requirement does not change the unit totals for the ADT as intermediate algebra is a pre-transfer level skill."
