GENERAL AGENDA ITEMS FOR INFORMATION/DISCUSSION:

Accreditation McKinley Williams reminded the CIC that the Accreditation (self-study of each college) Visit was approaching fast – October 14 – 16, 2008. There were ten standards for the last Accreditation in 2001. This time the ten have been combined into four standards, and CIC is responsible for Part A. Instructional Programs of Standard Two. The first draft is due December 2006. The CIC members were asked to review the Standard and be ready to accept assignments by next meeting.

Course Repeatability Wayne referred to pages 36 and 46 of the College Handbook regarding course repetition and grade remediation, whereas, it states that a course can only be repeated for furthering of skills or for study of another topic; or, if the course is eligible for grade remediation by repetition. Remediation by course repetition would allow a course to be repeated once for the purpose of improving the grade, and requires written approval of the dean of enrollment services. It was concluded that there are many courses in the catalog that are listed as repeatable in error and that this issue needs to be resolved divisionally. The CIC will consider bundling the corrections by departmental grouping. Two areas that have repeatability problems are Nursing and DSPS, where documentation is needed detailing the furthering of skills eligibility. Lynda will send a list of repeated courses to the CIC.

CIC ANNOUNCEMENTS: Kenyetta announced that the California community colleges are developing their common course numbering system and it will be called CID.
