OPEN DISCUSSION

Presentations from the Public/CIC Announcements There were no presentations from the public. Gabriela announced that CCC is still out of compliance with the state's requirement that all programs with local degree must also have an ADT, and that if the program is out of compliance, the local degree cannot be offered and must be removed from the catalog. While attending the ASCCC Spring Plenary, she learnt that Computer Science and Music transfer degrees are a problem statewide, with only about 25-30% compliance rate, because it's not reasonable to try to create a 60-unit degree for these two programs. She has asked for feedback from other colleges but has not received any. The ASCCC disagrees with the state and says that deactivating degrees is not the way to go.
