	statements.

	College Council - Carol said the FFE committee gave their
	report to College Council. There will be a mock office set up
	of sample furniture in AA-123 on Monday. There was an
	update on the Solar Panels. Tim gave a brief report on the
	environmental scan. President's Cabinet gave their
	recommendations on Student Behavior.
	Mack reported that 15 of the 30 buildings we have on campus
	need seismic retrofitting. We may have to tear down the Art
	Building as a trace fault line was discovered behind the High
	Tech Center. Even though that trace fault line has been inactive
	for thousands of years, the State will not fund us monies as they
	deem the Art Building unsafe. The other building that may be
	in jeopardy of demolition due to seismic safety issues is the
	ASU Building. The seismologists are working on their findings
	now. If repairs cost more than 50% of the demolition costs, we
	have to remove the building. We will have the Art Building
	empty by July. Jeff Kingston has suggested that any future
	buildings could be moved to the athletic fields as the fields are
	deemed seismically safe. This would mean moving the athletic
	fields somewhere else.

5. District Economic Impact Study	Mack distributed an Analysis of Proposal for an Economic
(from Chancellor's Cabinet)	Impact Study of the CCCCD on Contra Costa County. The
	District is looking at how all of us spend our money so we have
	an accounting of our contributions on the economic health of
	our county.
6. District Status Report on	Mack distributed Cabinet Funded Technology Initiatives Status
Technology (from Chancellor's	Report as of 9/12/06 which shows how the \$225,000 was to be
Cabinet)	spent on technology. We will add a 1-800 number for
	registration so our students do not have to pay a toll charge.
	The \$225,000 is one-time funds. There was some discussion
	about the registration system being down from December 21
	through January 2nd for conversion. We will have to put out a
	media blitz to faculty to remind them to turn in their grades no
	later than December 20th. We will also have to advertise early
	registration and remind prospective students they will not be
	able to register from December 21 through January 2nd.

	transcripts. This will also apply for those students called out of
	class for military leave. Lorena Herrera is the employee who
	handles Veterans registration.
9. Human Resources Board Policies	Carol distributed the revised Human Resources Board Policies
(from Chancellor's Cabinet)	that went to CCLC for review. They were approved at the
	September 26 cabinet meeting. They update our non-
	discrimination policy and a whistleblower protection policy was
	added.

10. Basic Skills Revenue Distribution and Staff Development Funds (from Chancellor's Cabinet)	Carol distributed Doug Robert's proposed estimate of our basic skills revenue distribution. All campuses are now reviewing all of their courses for accuracy for basic skills inclusion. Helen
	has said the monies granted from the State for basic skills will be disbursed to the colleges and not stay at the district office.
	Mack said that approximately 23% of students are enrolled in
	basic skills classes. This includes ESL classes. Ellen Smith
	clarified how some of our ESL classes are considered pre-
	collegiate basic skills and some are not. Pre-collegiate basic skills courses are those courses that don't get credit towards a
	degree.
11. Adjunct Faculty Over 60% (from	Carol distributed the list from the district showing all adjunct
Chancellor's Cabinet)	faculty that over 60%. We can longer allow this practice to
	continue and have to promote hiring more adjunct professors.
	The following title changes are now effective in the hiring
	announcements for faculty: non-tenured faculty are called
	Assistant Professors; tenured faculty are called Professors and part-time faculty are called Adjunct Professors.
12. Renovation of Track and Field	Carol said that Helen approved the dollars for all of the track
