1. Reports - Academic Senate, Classified Senate, ASU	Academic Senate - Terence did not have a report. He did though want to inform everyone about the student conference we are sponsoring along with San Mateo City College where 350 students will be attending from around the nation. The event will be held at the Crowne Plaza in San Mateo. ASU - Gigi reported that today is Spa Day beginning at 1:00 p.m. in gym. There will be massages, meditation and yoga. Free gift bags will be distributed at this event. May 3rd will be the Cinco de Mayo Celebration featuring performances by Los Cenzontles in the quad. Classified Senate - Benny had no report.
2. College Council Agenda	Added two items under standing item of remodel: 1. New construction start date for Student Activities Building 2. Path of Travel Timeline Added two items under unfinished business: 1. Report from FFE Committee 2. Recommendations and discussions on Student Behavior from President's Cabinet. Recommendations on Student Behavior are: a. Hold forums to discuss appropriate behavior. b. Include expected behavior in new student orientation. c. Classified and Academic Senates need to develop a Code of Ethics. (The managers and students have already done this.) d. List the Student Code of Ethics on the Webadvisor so students would have to read it before they register for classes. e. More visibility of staff and managers needs to occur on campus. f. Hold general assemblies for faculty, staff and students after classes have begun. Also have an All College Day to include students.

	g. Hold a student appreciation day during the semester where the students are able to give feedback on their expectations.
3. California Educational Opportunity Report - Roadblocks to College	Carol Maga distributed the <i>California Educational Opportunity 2006 Report: Roadblocks to College</i> she received at a recent conference. The report is realistically depressing showing statistics of California students and some of the reasons why they, or a very low percentage, do not enter into college from high school. California has more students per teachers than any other State in the nation. Mack said the report validates our reasons for continuing to work with our feeder high schools and give our high school students opportunities in order to combat some of those reasons listed in the report. Mack asked Carol to send this report to everyone on campus via e-mail. Mack also suggested that the Academic Senate and managers hold a forum to discuss the report. Carol will add this to her Council of Chairs agenda and Terence will be invited for discussion on this item.
